**End-of-Term Self-Assessment Report
on the Action Plan of the Czech Republic
Open Government Partnership
for 2023 to 2024**

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Introduction

The present End-of-Term Self-Assessment Report on the Action Plan of the Czech Republic Open Government Partnership for 2023 to 2024 (hereafter referred to as the "Self-Assessment Report") in accordance with the [OGP Participation and Co-creation Standards](#) (hereafter referred to as the "Standards") and the [OGP National Handbook](#), issued by the international initiative Open Government Partnership (hereinafter referred to as "OGP"), on the basis of the prescribed template, evaluates the implementation of the commitments of the Action Plan of the Czech Republic for Open Government Partnership 2023 to 2024 (hereinafter referred to as the "Sixth Action Plan") for the period since its approval by the Resolution of the Government of the Czech Republic of 15. February 2023 No. 117 until 31 December 2024. A longer period is evaluated only where explicitly stated in the Self-Assessment Report. The information presented in Sections 3, 4 and 5 of this Self-Assessment Report is based on the partial inputs and other information provided by the implementing agencies of the individual commitments.

The evaluated Sixth Action Plan, like the previous action plans, fulfilled all four OGP values - access to information, public participation, accountability, technology and innovation. The commitments of the Sixth Action Plan were intended in part to help ensure that all resources are spent efficiently, cost-effectively and that the scope for potential corruption is significantly reduced in cooperation with civil society. An integral prerequisite and one of the sub-objectives of the Sixth Action Plan was to make as much usable data as possible available to the general public.

Just like the previous action plans, the Sixth Action Plan and the commitments contained therein did not represent the main instrument for the implementation of public administration reforms and its greater opening to civil society in the Czech Republic compared to some other OGP member states, but rather a complementary instrument that appropriately complemented other comprehensive reform strategic documents and was linked to them in terms of content. This was the case, for example, with the concept of Client-oriented Public Administration 2030 or the Strategic Framework Czech Republic 2030. The Czech Republic again pursued the implementation of the *"16. Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions at all levels"*, and specifically targets *"16.5 Substantially reduce corruption and bribery in all their forms"*, *"16.6 Develop effective, accountable and transparent institutions at all levels"* and *"16.7 Ensure responsible, inclusive, participatory, and representative decision making at all levels"*.

1 Action Plan Process

The implementation of the commitments of the Sixth Action Plan was evaluated and commented on throughout the period under review by [the Working Commission of the Chairman of the Government Anti-Corruption Council for Open Government and Transparency of Public Administration](#) (hereinafter referred to as the "Working Commission"). Within the OGP processes, the Working Commission serves as a multi-stakeholder forum, with members from both the Government and the non-governmental sector representing NGOs, academia and trade unions. The Working Commission generally met once every three months in person, on-line or, exceptionally, in a hybrid format. The Working Commission also discussed some important procedural steps and submissions *per rollam*. The statutes and rules of procedure of the Working Commission are determined by [the statute](#) and [rules of procedure](#) of the Government Anti-Corruption Council, that are published on-line. The minutes of the meetings of the Working



Commission were also published on-line on an ongoing basis. In view of the above, it can be concluded that the minimum requirement of Standards 1.1 has been met.

In addition to the records of the Working Commission meetings, information on the implementation of the commitments was published on the website korupce.cz in the section dedicated to the Partnership for Open Government (<https://korupce.cz/partnerstvi-pro-otevrene-vladnuti-ogp/>), and for the Sixth Action Plan in the section dedicated to its implementation (<https://korupce.cz/partnerstvi-pro-otevrene-vladnuti-ogp/narodni-akcni-plany-nap/sesty-akcni-plan-2023-2024/faze-implementace/>). The aforementioned part of the korupce.cz website, together with the section dedicated to the Working Commission and the news section, serves as the national website for the OGP and as a *repository* for *OGP-related* documents. An exception to the quarterly publication period was the last six months of the implementation of the Sixth Action Plan, when the progress was discussed in the context of the agenda items of the Working Commission on the development of the Czech Republic Open Government Partnership Action Plan for the period 2025-2026 (hereinafter referred to as the "Seventh Action Plan") and discussed separately and collectively only at its December meeting. Progress in the last month of implementation is only reflected in this Self-Assessment Report. The general public, beyond the members of the Working Commission, was thus kept informed of the status of the implementation of the Sixth Action Plan and had the opportunity to comment on it both in writing by post or via a dedicated e-mail address, and by telephone or in person at the Working Commission meetings, which, if they wished, could be attended on invitation by members of the Working Commission. In view of the above, it can be concluded that the minimum requirements of Standards 2.1, 2.2 and 5.1 have been met.

At the beginning of the process of co-creation of the Self-Assessment Report on 15 January 2025, the Working Commission *per rollam* approved the [co-creation schedule](#). Subsequently, the draft Self- Assessment Report was submitted to the inter-ministerial comment procedure from 7 to 21 February 2025 and simultaneously published for public consultation from 7 February 2025.

2 Use of IRM Recommendations

The recommendations of the IRM contained in the [Czech Republic Co-Creation Brief 2022](#) of March 2022 were taken into account in the discussion of the draft commitments of the Sixth Action Plan. From a procedural point of view, this was mainly an effort to involve new implementing agencies and ministries in the creation of the Sixth Action Plan, which was successful for the commitments of the Ministry of Regional Development and the Ministry of Finance. Thematically, the IRM recommendation to continue efforts to improve the status of whistleblowers was then taken into account. The implementation of the commitments made in the Sixth Action Plan took into account the IRM recommendations contained in the October 2023 [Action Plan Review: Czech Republic 2022–2024](#).

On commitment 4.1, the IRM stated that the expected results would be boosted by the wider use of the methodology in public administration beyond the testing phase. Although the methodology was not used more widely, the relevant unit of the Office of the Government of the Czech Republic undertook further activities to promote participation and organised events for both professional and general public.

On commitment 4.2, the IRM stated that more significant results could be achieved through new activities to support the implementation of the new legislation, methodological advice in adopting and implementing the reporting mechanisms with central and local authorities, supporting and

encouraging networking of persons investigating whistleblower complaints, and using real case scenarios in media campaigns. In addition to these recommendations, the Ministry of Justice has undertaken many relevant activities in response to both the public and private sectors.

Although the progress in the implementation of commitment 4.6 was limited in the reporting period, CSOs were involved in discussions on its implementation in line with the recommendations of the IRM and also proposed follow-up commitments for the next period.

Commitment 4.7 was completed properly and on time, also following the IRM recommendations with the allocation of the necessary resources. Progress in its implementation was extensively consulted and commented on regularly at the Working Party meetings.

In line with the IRM recommendation, civil society organisations with relevant expertise and experience in this policy area were involved in the commenting of the analytical material in commitment 4.8. In addition to statistical data from the Beneficial Owners Registry and public registers data for the analytical material was also collected anonymously from 10 Czech banks through a questionnaire in cooperation with the Czech Banking Association, from information provided to the questionnaire by the relevant courts, from the Ministry for Regional Development, the Financial Analysis Office, the Czech National Bank and the Prague City Hall.

This was due to both the original approved milestone schedule, which extended beyond the implementation period of the Sixth Action Plan, and subsequent delays against the schedule, which necessitated the submission of a new schedule. The delay was caused by the contractor's delay in the work and the slower provision of assistance by the client in the case of eEdu-I, and by the fact that no tenderer applied for the first contract in the case of eEdu-II. 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4 Lessons and Insights

Based on the above results. What are the main lessons and insights you have gained in the development and implementation of the Sixth Action Plan?

On commitment 4.1:

Partnership cooperation between representatives of the non-profit sector (or other stakeholders) and government representatives is time-consuming and capacity-intensive, but ultimately beneficial. The result is consensus on documents (draft public policies, strategies, etc.) with broad support.

On commitment 4.7:

The Sixth Action Plan focuses on facilitating public access to information, publishing data in open formats and reducing corruption risks in the civil service. Close cooperation with data providers and NGOs is essential to further improve the quality and availability of subsidy data. The basic direction that it makes sense to invest in technologies and processes that facilitate automation and efficiency in data cleaning and management has been confirmed. Thanks to the successful consolidation and centralisation of subsidy information, as well as the increased quality and availability of data through systematic cleaning, open data can subsequently be used for analytical purposes, promoting transparency and public awareness.

5 Recommendations

What are the necessary actions to be taken on the basis of the above results? What adjustments are needed? What other actions, not necessarily identified in the Sixth Action Plan, are needed to make progress on commitments? Who needs to be involved for the results to be achieved?

On commitment 4.1:

It is necessary to continue to maintain and develop cooperation between the state administration and other stakeholders (especially non-governmental non-profit organisations) and to create conditions and opportunities for joint partnership work. One of the possibilities is targeted training for the central authorities on cooperation with the non-profit sector.

On commitment 4.4:

The updated Database of Strategies is only a part of the whole complex of strategic work in the public administration of the Czech Republic and therefore will not work well without the necessary linkage to this complex. It is necessary to continue to work on all the main pillars, i.e. to have quality strategists who have the necessary knowledge and skills, work with quality strategic documents, have the will to manage them well and have the ability to follow the planned change.

On commitment 4.7:

Due to the new approach to the method of publishing data on state budget subsidies through the publicly accessible information website of the State Treasury Monitor, it is necessary to ensure the update of the relevant legislation to ensure an effective transition from IS ReD while

maintaining the necessary functionalities, the scope of published data and the history of data concentrated in IS ReD. As the data on subsidies provided in the Monitor will be based on data from the budget system, it can be assumed that the quality of the published data will be improved.
